BENEFITS AND FEATURES

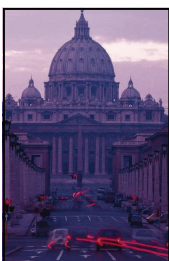
- Unlimited travel on the national rail network of France and Italy.
- 1st class & 2nd class.
- Basic Pass : any 4 days within a 2-month period.
- Travel days may be used consecutively or non-consecutively.
- **Saver pass** for 2 to 5 adults traveling together at all times.
- **Youth pass** in 2nd class only, for travelers from 12 up to 25 included on the first day of travel.
- Eurail France - Italy pass offers a passholder fare on the Eurostar.



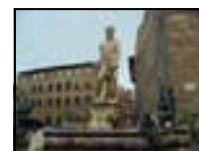
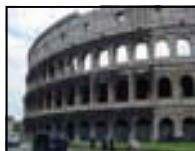
Options

- Ability to add up to 6 additional rail days.
- No Senior pass offered
- Access to High-Speed **ES*** and **Cisalpino trains** (**Reservations are compulsory**).
- Valid on the RER-lines B (only Airport CDG-Paris Nord), C (Orly Airport-Downtown Paris, Versailles), D (Auvers-sur-Oise) & E. Not valid on RER A (Disneyland Paris), RER B's urban section (Paris center), Metro and buses.
- 1st class Pass valid on the **Leonardo Express** (Rome Fiumicino airport-Roma Termini).
- **Passholder fares** on domestic **TGVs, Eurostar, Thalys, Artesia Day & Night, Elipsos, TGV Lyria, Geneve Med TGV, Paris-Germany Night, Bruxelles-France TGV.**
- Special travel bonuses (to be arranged locally) :
- **Bonuses: FRANCE-ITALY:** Ferry Civitavecchia-Toulon operated by Grimaldi Ferries

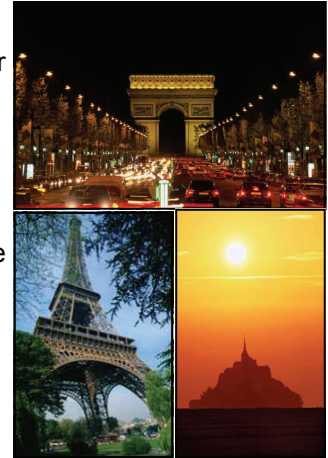


- Free ferry crossings from Villa S. Giovanni to Messina (Sicily) operated by Trenitalia (Standard class).



50% reduction on :

- passenger fares on Sea France Ferries operating between Calais and Dover (discount not available from Dover).
- The Seine River cruises with Bateaux Parisiens.
- The Paris Story attraction (film on the history of Paris).
- The private scenic rail line from Nice to Digne “Chemins de Fer de Provence”.
- The railways network in Corsica.
- The Scenic railways Vivarais (Ardèche).

**20% reduction on :**

- The Discovery Pass for guided tours and museums in Dijon.
- The Grevin waxwork museums in Paris, Lourdes, Tours, Salon de Provence or St Jean de Luz.

- People with a permanent residence (for more than 6 months) outside of Europe, the United Kingdom, Turkey, Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia or the Russian Federation are eligible to purchase or use a Eurail France - Italy Pass.
 - Passes must be validated within **6 months** of issuing date by a railway official in France or Italy (station's desk) who also fills in the passport number.
 - Passes must be validated prior to boarding 1st train (All parties must be present when validating a Saverpass).
 - The date of travel has to be entered in the correct way before boarding the first train, **by the traveler**, in the corresponding box of the calendar.
 - **7:00pm rule:** if an overnight train starts after 7:00pm on a validated Eurail France - Italy Pass, the passholder must enter the next day's date on the pass, provided it falls within the validity of the pass.
 - A resident of Europe, the Russian Federation, Turkey, Morocco, Algeria or Tunisia who temporarily reside in the US with a Visa (of any type) is not regarded as someone who is eligible to use or purchase this pass.
 - Person's using a U.S. Military I.D. is eligible to use this pass.

Children's rule

- Children from 4 up to 11 included on the first day of travel: reduced rate applies.
- Children up to 3 included on the first day of travel: free when sharing an adult passenger's seat/bed.

- Eurail France - Italy Pass must be presented for refund unused and not validated.
- An 85% refund applies to totally unused passes returned within **one year** of issuing date.
- Eurail France - Italy Pass are not refundable and cannot be replaced if lost, stolen or partially used.
- Lost or stolen passes may be protected with the purchase of a Rail Protection Plan.

FAQ's

1. Can I take the TGV and ES* train on a Eurail France 'n Italy Pass?

Eurail France 'n Italy Passes are accepted on TGV and ES trains. Reservation is compulsory and at additional cost*

2. Why make reservations?

Reservations are compulsory on all TGVs, Eurostar Italia (ES), international and night trains. In general, we always recommend reservations for journeys of 2 hours and more as it guarantees a seat on a train and is definitely a small cost for extra comfort and peace of mind*

3. Can I add additional days once I arrive in France or Italy?

No, additional days are only available through Euro Railways and cannot be purchased locally

4. Do I have to make sleeper reservations even though I have a railpass/Do I have to make reservations if I bought a France 'n Italy Pass?

A Eurail France' n Italy Pass does not guarantee seat/sleeper reservation. Reservations are mandatory on all TGV, ES* and night trains.

5. Are meals included in 1st class?

Meals are not included in 1st class when traveling on domestic French routes. However buffet carts are available in all TGVs and ES* trains and most stations features delis/bakeries. Artesia Night sleeper tickets include breakfast

6. Do people always need to travel together on a Saverpass?

All passengers listed on the Saverpass must be present at the time of validation of their pass. All or only part of the group may travel but only upon presentation of the Saverpass and the control coupons (which means that the remainder passengers listed on the pass cannot travel)

7. Which rate am I entitled to on Artesia Night and Day Trains

Eurail France 'n Italy Pass holders only need a Pass 1 fare (lowest fare) to travel on Artesia Day and Night trains (valid for **ALL** routes)

8. Does the Eurail France 'n Italy Pass covers travel on Paris-Venice Artesia Night train?

Yes it does. Passenger **ONLY** need to purchase a Pass 1 fare (no additional ticket is required for the Swiss portion of the journey)

9. Does the Eurail France 'n Italy Pass include ferry service to Sicily?

Yes it does. In 2nd class only (from Villa S. Giovanni to Messina)

10. Can you return to France once you go to Italy/Can you return to Italy once you go to France?

Yes you can. Client is free to organize his/her itinerary as he/she wishes (ex. 5-day pass holder can spend 4 days traveling in France and 1 day traveling in Italy or 5 days traveling within Italy and not go to France at all)

11. Does the Eurail France 'n Italy Pass cover the Leonardo Express train from Rome airport to Roma Termini Station?

1st class Eurail France 'n Italy Pass does cover the Leonardo Express journey

12. What happens if I want to take a side trip to Switzerland?

Client can take a side trip to Switzerland but will need to buy additional tickets to cover the Swiss portions of their trips (French or Italian border town ticket – Swiss destination)
