Swiss Mountain Top

Round trip travel from Interlaken, Grindelwald or Wengen to the Jungfraujoch – at 11,333 feet, the highest railway station in Europe.

- Entitles the holder to round trip travel to the Jungfraujoch – Top of Europe from Interlaken, Grindelwald or Wengen.
- The voucher has to be exchanged at the train station in Interlaken Ost, Grindelwald or Wengen.
- This unique round-trip by modern cog-wheel railway first takes client to Kleine Scheidegg, altitude 2,061 meters (6,762 feet), at the foot of the notorious Eiger North Wall. From here, the Jungfrau Railway climbs to the Eiger Glacier Station, well known for its mountain restaurant and



polar dog kennels.

- The trip continues through the Eiger tunnel, to the Eigerwand and Eismeer stations, with a five-minute stop at each station. Client can enjoy some spectacular sight-seeing through large observation windows, hewn from solid Alpine rock.
- Arrive on the Jungfraujoch, in the heart of a glorious glacier world on the very roof of Europe! Superb views extend as far as the summits of the Vosges Mountains in France and the Black Forest in Germany.

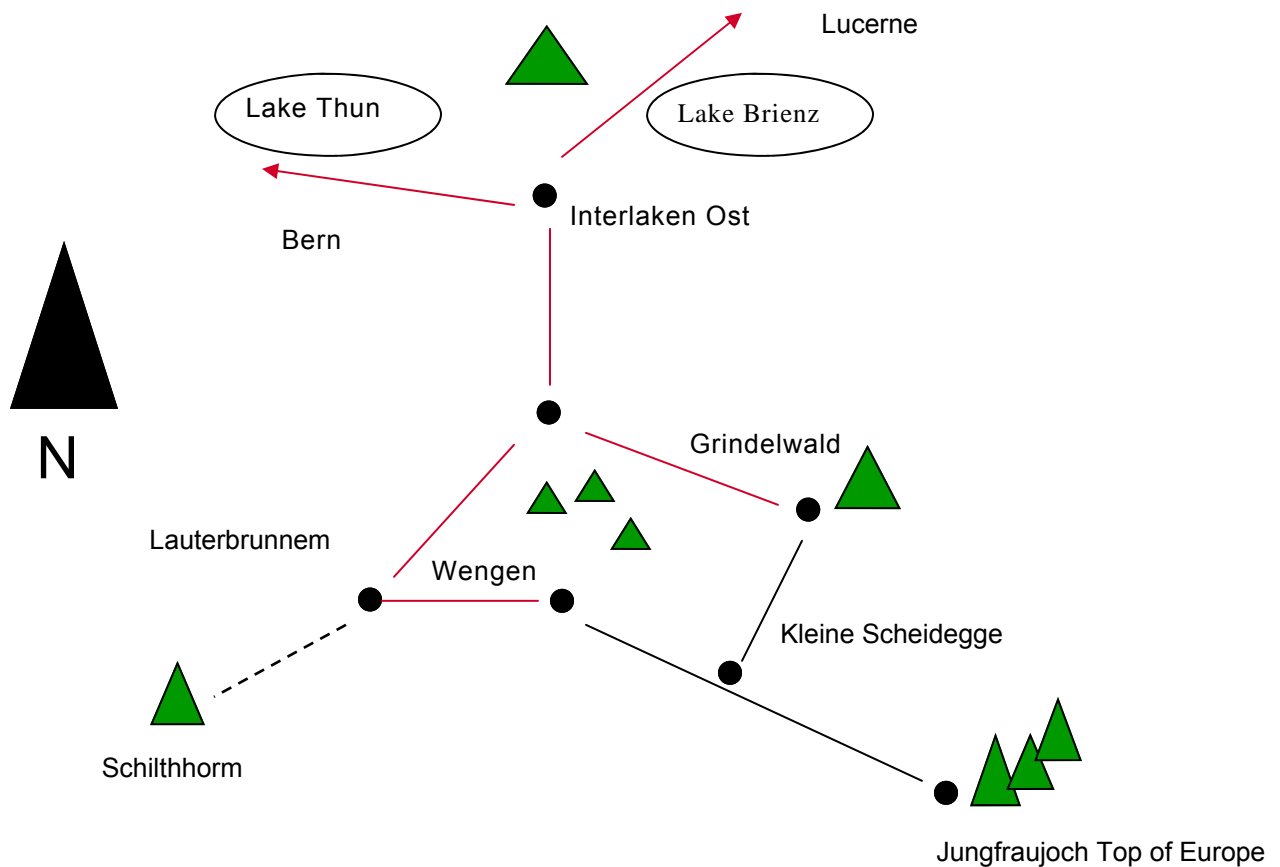

Attractions on the Jungfrauoch:

The Great Aletsch Glacier, at 22 km (13.6 miles) the longest ice-stream in the Alps, begins directly on the Jungfrauoch - Top of Europe.

Ice Palace, Ice Gateway, Sphinx observation terrace, Plateau with hiking in the eternal snow, "Top of Europe" Glacier Restaurant, summer ski & snowboard park, husky-drawn sled rides, summer adventure attractions and High Alpine Research Exhibitions.

→ From Wengen and Grindelwald up to the Jungfrauoch only 2nd class is available

Refund policy

- Vouchers may be refunded up to 6 months from the date of issue. A 15% cancellation penalty applies.
- Once voucher has been exchanged, refund is not possible.
- Rail Protection Plan does not apply.

Four important rules:

To understand the Jungfrauoch ticket completely, pay attention to the following 4 facts:

1. Eurail passes are valid until Interlaken - Swiss Passes until Grindelwald/Wengen.
2. Eurail pass holders receive a discounted fare from Interlaken and Swiss Pass holders receive a reduced fare from Grindelwald/Wengen (25%).
3. Customers with a Eurailticket (point -to-point), Swiss Transfer Ticket or any other ticket are not eligible for a reduction and have to pay full price.
4. The train from Lauterbrunnen-Wengen or Grindelwald up to Kleine Scheidegg (change of trains) and then up to the Jungfrauoch only carries 2nd class seats.

1. *What do children under 16 have to pay when traveling alone and without Swiss Family Card?*

Answer: Children under 16 pay half of the adult fare. Since most of trips start from Interlaken, there is only a ticket from Interlaken up to the Jungfrauoch for children. Price: \$78 (USD) in 1st class or \$72 (USD) in 2nd class.

2. *Can a Eurail Selectpass holder start from Wengen or Grindelwald with this ticket and pay supplements for additional fees or can they only start in Interlaken? If applicable, what would the supplements be?*

Answer: Eurail Selectpass (Switzerland must be included) is only valid as far as Interlaken. The client must purchase the reduced Passholder ticket from Interlaken Ost. Price: \$116 (USD) in 1st class or \$110 (USD) in 2nd class. Again, since most of these clients are probably starting the trip from Interlaken, there is only a ticket from Interlaken Ost up to the Jungfrauoch.

3. *Why is there no 1st class option for Swiss Pass holders?*

Answer: The Swiss Pass will cover travel as far as Grindelwald and Wengen. From these cities, travel is in 2nd class only.

4. *What does "Not valid to the Jungfrauoch on the in- and outbound journey" mean with regards to the Swiss Card?*

Answer: The Swiss Card is (1) valid for an in and outbound trip from the Airport/border to any

destination in Switzerland and (2) grants 50% reduction on additional tickets during client's stay. Since mountain peaks and the Jungfrauoch are not considered destinations, the Swiss Card can not be used to cover travel to the Jungfrauoch.

5. *Can only Swiss Pass holders start from Wengen and Grindelwald?*

Answer: No, everybody can start the trip in Wengen or Grindelwald. Since the Swiss Passes are valid until Grindelwald and Wengen, we only offer the passholder fares. Clients without a Swiss Pass already staying in Grindelwald or Wengen, have to purchase the (full price) ticket locally.

6. *What kind of Eurailticket do you need to get the Eurailticket or Swiss Transfer Ticket fares? Are these fares in addition to the ticket?*

These prices are full fare and without any reduction (see rule 3) so you will not need any tickets to receive these fares.
